IBBY Sri Lanka is making arrangements to conduct the Convention on Literature for Children and Youth online, as a two-day webinar. Whilst the event will be held at the end of 2020, the exact dates will be publicised in the months ahead.

The Convention will bring together a panel of eminent resource persons, from Sri Lanka and also the rest of the Asia-Oceania region. They will include authors, illustrators, editors and publishers of literature for young people. The presentations will be done 'live' at the event.

Audience participation will be by a registration process. Only a nominal registration fee will be charged, and a special rate will be offered to those who wish to participate on both days.



'The Tree of Life' is one of the 108 auspicious signs in traditional Sinhala art, symbolic of **wonder**, **good luck** and **prosperity**. In the reproduction above, the different elements have been coloured to reflect the colours representing the 9 directions according to Chinese custom. Thus, symbolising IBBY, spread in all directions around the globe.
