Library, A School





· Project Overview

"A Library, A School" is an initiative aimed at equipping public schools with libraries tailored for children aged 3 to 12 years old. The project will cover all regions of Morocco, starting with areas affected by the September 2023 earthquake, as well as schools that currently have no books in their establishments.

The goal is to provide students with **high-quality resources** that encourage reading as a **tool for both learning and enjoyment**, while adhering to **international book selection standards**.



· Project Objectives

- Equip 100 public schools with complete libraries in the first phase,
- Provide children with access to diverse and age-appropriate books,
- Strengthen reading culture in an educational setting,
- Encourage writing and verbal expression among students,
- Develop critical thinking and curiosity,
- Reduce educational inequalities, in alignment with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

· Library Content

Each school will receive a library containing **7 themed book sets**, corresponding to different educational levels (from preschool to 6th grade).

Each box contains a selection of 30 books, carefully chosen based on the following criteria:

- Priority to high-quality Moroccan books,
- Selection based on international organization standards,
- Books must be legally printed and published,
- Works that combine modernity and tradition.



Content Distribution by Age Group:

- Preschool (ages 3-6): picture books, introduction to letters and numbers, simple stories.
- 1st grade (ages 6-7): short stories, basic math concepts, respect, and cooperation.
- 2nd grade (ages 7-8): longer stories, first steps in comprehension and analysis.
- 3rd grade (ages 8-9): introduction to critical thinking, ecology, and human values.
- 4th grade (ages 9-10): more complex subjects, environment, energy, and history.
- 5th grade (ages 10-11): literary and scientific texts, space, climate change.
- 6th grade (ages 11-12): advanced texts on science, history, and values.

· Associated Activities

- **Educational and recreational workshops** for students,
- **Teacher training** on how to integrate books into the classroom,
- **Promotion of reading for pleasure** through events and activities.

· Expected Impact

- @ Encourage reading and learning from an early age,
- @ Develop analytical, writing, and verbal communication skills,
- © Support teachers with high-quality teaching materials,
- © Contribute to a more equitable and inclusive education system.
